

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AN INTRODUCTION TO WORLDWISE



Overview

Worldwise is a global citizenship programme created initially by the World Development Movement, for adults who want to make connections between their own lives and the changing world around them.

Using these connections (both local and global) as the context, skills required for working together are explored and developed.

It has been adapted over a period of six years using the participation and evaluations often very different adult education groups in Dundee. This has produced an accessible programme for workers and participants alike and, encourages a far greater degree of group ownership. (See Worldwise Structure page 3)

The aims of the Worldwise Project are:

- To increase awareness and understanding of the interdependency of people's lives both locally and globally
- To increase awareness and understanding of the forces which shape our lives – social, economic, political and environmental etc,
- To develop critical thinking and creativity
- To increase active global citizenship and promote social inclusion

The ethos of Worldwide

Worldwise is a participatory, activity-based course. It aims to teach at an introductory level particular skills and information about global justice issues. However, it is primarily designed to provide a fun, interactive and participant-centred approach to learning.

A good course will:

- Ground participants in the central themes of justice, sustainability and Solidarity
- Value the diversity of people and experience in the group
- Empower participants with practical information and encouragement
- Allow people space to develop and express their own views

Why be Worldwide?

In a globalised world we are connected to others in a way that has never been experienced before. World-wise is all about exploring those connections and finding ways to think, campaign and live in solidarity with our neighbours around the world.

Even when we're quietly going about our own business, our choices and behaviour have an impact in far-off places. From the clothes we wear to the TV we watch, our actions plug us into the wider supply chain of international affairs. But this also positions us as potential change-makers in a global system that profits the rich and powerful at the rest of the world's expense.
